HISTORICAL MILESTONES



- **Est Dec 15, 1941 Ex Order 9282**
 - 64,938 Acres (Cherokee and Muskogee Counties)
 - Named after BG Edmund L. Gruber, Ft. Sill
- **Start Feb 1942 and finished May 21, 1942**
 - 2,250 BUILDINGS
 - 1600 bed hospital, 479 barracks, 12 chapels, 4 theaters
- **WW II Stationed Units**
 - 88 Inf Div (Blue Devil) July 1942
 - 42nd Inf Div.(Rainbow) 1943
 - 86th Inf Div.(Black Hawk) July 1945 (Prep for the Pacific)
- **POW Camp until May 1946**
- **Closed at End of WWII (June 3, 1947)**
- **Reopened under NG purview in 1977**
- **1988-1994 Only NG AAS School operated**
